Peasants into Frenchmen (Eugen Weber)


Describing the nineteenth century:

"In Ariège families ate grass, hungry peasants were "eager to get into prison," mendicancy was chronic, armies of beggars descended into the plains, and ...travelers were beset by legions of children seeking alms" (p. 17)

Describing the early twentieth century:

"Old folk ... had no fond remembrance of the old days. For them ..., the past
was a time of misery and barbarism, the present a time of unexampled comfort
and security, of machines and schooling and services, of all the wonders that are
translated as civilization" (p. 478)
